ADRA has been operating in Somali since 1992 implementing emergency relief and development interventions in Education; Livelihood and Economic Development; Renewable Energy; and Water, sanitation and health (WASH). ADRA's work in Somali is anchored on a programming approach that recognises the essence of the communities taking leadership in their own development. Interventions by ADRA in Somali do not relegate the communities to be mere recipients of aid but significant partners in formulation and execution of strategies that address their needs, therefore attaining sustainable positive change in their lives through development and relief initiatives.

PARTNERSHIPS AND PARTICIPATIONS

ADRA in Somali has partnered with several development agencies, government ministries and departments and educational and research institutions to deliver development programs to communities throughout the country. ADRA has developed excellent relationships with both international and local non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and Community based organizations (CBOs) in Somalia and often partner with organizations to further our objectives.

Currently, we have a total portfolio of USD **10,446,294**. The funding covers different sectors that include livelihood and economic development; education; water, health and sanitation; emergency management and renewable energy. A total of **599,790** beneficiaries in Somali have been reached.

LIVELIHOOD & AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

ADRA under the Somalia Resilience Program (SomReP) implements drought recovery livelihoods, food security and resilient projects aimed at building community assets and creating safety nets which enables the beneficiaries to withstand the effects of recurring disasters in Somali.

Our approaches include introduction of innovative technologies and skills that build on communities' indigenous technical knowhow, value addition and marketing chain development; interdiction of modern farming practices and conservation agriculture, rehabilitation of irrigation infrastructure; drip irrigation; solar water pumps; animal husbandry; capacity development training on farming techniques; mobilization of social capital through development of farmers association and cooperatives.

EDUCATION

ADRA aims to increase education opportunities for all relevant age groups in Somalia there by contributing to thriving peaceful societies. ADRA strives to increase inclusive access and completion of education to learners at all levels and to strengthen systems, structures and human resource for effective delivery of services.

ADRA's education programming is geared towards basic education development, functional adult learning, vocational education and rehabilitation, construction and reactivation of primary education.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

ADRA Somalia WASH and health programming consists of a set of integrated interventions aimed at increasing accessibility and availability of safe portable water through rehabilitation, drilling of borehole wells and hand dug wells. These initiatives result in long term impacts that are related to relief and development of marginalized and vulnerable communities resulting in sustainable positive change that include diversification of livelihood and improved sanitation facilities for primary school education.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

ADRA's emergency management approach is to save lives and reduce suffering to disaster affected community, deliver coordinated and integrated emergency life saving interventions to affected communities and strengthen preparedness, mitigation and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) programs that benefited vulnerable households.

The initial interventions were in emergency and relief, but currently the interventions have expanded to include rehabilitations and development interventions in health, water, education, energy, agriculture, cash for work, food for work, distribution of Non-Food Items (NFI) and capacity building.
